

Have your say on permanent proposals for Ridgmount Gardens







Making your neighbourhood safer and healthier

The Covid-19 pandemic has changed how people in Camden live, travel and work. We want our streets to have more safe space for everyone to walk and cycle, for children to get to and from school safely and healthily, for businesses to be able to flourish, to reduce carbon emissions from vehicles and for you to be breathing cleaner air.

We want to ensure that our streets support a strong recovery from the pandemic and provide a lasting legacy of greener, safer, healthier travel. Whether it's an essential journey like taking your children to school, getting to work or just popping out to enjoy your local park we want you to love where you live, and to love Camden.

This letter concerns the Council's proposal to introduce two way cycling on Ridgmount Gardens. In line with the Camden Transport Strategy, it is policy to make streets two-way for cycling wherever possible. We want to know what you think of this proposal.

What's the challenge on Ridgmount Gardens

This proposal is part of the West End Project which was approved by full Cabinet in January 2015. Further information on this can be viewed on these websites:

As part of this scheme, a number of streets were selected to enhance cycle access throughout the project area and this is one of those identified. Surveys have been undertaken to confirm the street's suitability in terms of traffic flows and speeds. If approved, the proposal is subject to a road safety audit before and after implementation.



What would change?

Depending on the outcome of this consultation a decision will be taken on whether to proceed. To make the changes to two way cycling we would:

- Install longer double yellow lines at the junctions of the road to improve sightlines.
- Relocate an existing disabled permit holders bay.
- Adjust the arrangement of the residents' and pay and display parking bays, as per the plan included. There would be no loss of overall parking spaces as a result of these changes.
- Install signs and cycle logos to inform drivers of cyclists travelling two-way.





What would not change?

- There would be no overall loss in parking spaces.
- The road would remain one-way for motor vehicles.
